# FROM THE ACHOA BOARD PRESIDENT by Bob Kirtley



Hello to all our homeowners.

Summer sure is here. This has been our longest stretch of temperatures over 90° in recent memory. Hope everyone is enjoying the pool and Lake Tahoe. Skiing at Squaw on the 4<sup>th</sup> was great but now we should look at the effects of our wet winter.

Everyone has noticed the nasty brown carpet growing over much of the common areas. The most invasive grass is "cheat grass" and the amount of this nasty turf has exploded across our acreage in recent months. The ACHOA has several initiatives under way to reduce the danger of fire. One of the most interesting ideas is to graze goats in the overgrown areas to remove the low-lying fuels. The areas would be reseeded with native grasses that compete well with the cheat grass. In time, we would be able to restore a large portion of the natural habitat. What we discovered is Nevada goats are in high demand!

The Fuels Reduction Committee and the Safety Committee did great work with its sponsored events. The committees had Smokey the Bear and our local firefighting agencies out to meet our homeowners. The joint meetings with Washoe County and the Club at Arrowcreek led to devising a great strategy to win a huge grant for fire suppression in Arrowcreek. The details of the grant will be posted later but I want to thank the Fuels Reduction Committee for their incredible work

The Board is working with Ed, your GM, Elvin and Dave, your senior staff, Rick, your Director of Security and Jeanne, your Community Manager to identify the major upcoming capital projects and cataloging the largest maintenance issues that the community faces. Everyone has benefited from the ACHOA holding monthly assessments level for the last 5 years. The downside for the community is that we are facing deferred maintenance on many of our assets that now require our attention. This cost is being addressed by the Budget and Finance and Reserve Committee in planning the 2018 Budget.

Our tireless management team of Ed, Elvin and Dave have focused on landscaping, water supply purity, buildings, roads, and bridges within the Association. All areas need attention but the one of the largest assets needing rebuilding are the community's drainage ditches. Over the years, the ditches have slowly filled with sand and fine grit. In doing so, the ditches are not as deep as they should be. The shallow ditches carry much less water per minute leading to washouts across the roads and sidewalks. The first task will be to use vacuum trucks to clean out the existing pipes and silt traps. The ditches will be flushed to increase their capacity. Long term, we will budget several hundred thousand dollars to rebuild the ditches intended to carry the most water.

The community has been diligent in building its Reserve Fund so we have a good starting point from our financial perspective. The previous road plans were well executed but other areas did not garner the same amount of attention. The new community maintenance plans will be developed for all the main asset classes and will be a rolling 5-year plan for the community. Each phase will have a costing estimate and will be explicitly budgeted for in the annual budget cycle. We expect the total amounts of expenditures for Reserve projects which are primarily maintenance and capital to be much higher over the next 5 years than the last 5 years.

We are always in need of community volunteers. If you are interested in joining a committee, contact me or Jeanne Tarantino. We want talented people to contribute ideas for the long-term success of Arrowcreek!

# CONGRATULATIONS ARE IN ORDER! GRANT FUNDS ARE COMING OUR WAY



We are excited to bring you great news. Early this year, the ACHOA, Friends of ArrowCreek (FOA) owners of The Club at ArrowCreek, and Washoe County formed a unique partnership and applied for a \$292,000 grant in a cooperative effort to reduce hazardous fuels in and around the ArrowCreek community over the next two-year period. We were recently notified that this unique partnership will be getting that grant, which makes the three partners on target to help prevent wildfires in the ArrowCreek Community.

Targeted areas will be open space owned by the ACHOA and The Club at ArrowCreek, along with several selected areas adjacent to the ArrowCreek Community owned by Washoe County. Funding from this grant is designed to assist homeowners in creating 100 feet of defensible/survivable space around structures in the mentioned areas. Fuels reduction on privately-owned lots continues to be the responsibility of each homeowner.

The ACHOA, The Club at ArrowCreek (FOA), and County will use grant funds to masticate brush in mosaic patterns, creating mulch that will be left on the soil to help with erosion and invasive species control. A selective pre-emergent, which inhibits cheat grass, will also be applied after the mastication. The County will add another component, goats and sheep will be grazing on their property.

The partners are in the process of executing contracts with the State, which will take a little time. Fuels reduction cannot start until the weather is much cooler but not when snow is on the ground. Based on those conditions, it may be late fall before work can start. Please be aware that over the next couple years, you will see--and hear--contractors working in various common HOA areas and in The Club at ArrowCreek owned property. In addition to contractors, sheep and maybe goats will be helping the County reduce fuels using large appetites!

During this two-year period needed to complete the work funded by the grant, the ACHOA is currently funding defensible space evaluations for over 400 homes. The resulting reports will assist homeowners in taking steps to create defensible/survivable space on their own lots. Booklets from Living with Fire are available at the Residents Center to help homeowners understand how to create "defensible space".

The ACHOA, The Club at ArrowCreek (FOA), and Washoe County have taken a giant step forward by working together as a team to protect the residents and property within the ArrowCreek Community from potential wildfires. We have just proven that great things can happen when people work together for the good of this community!





### RADAR CAMERAS & STOP SIGN CHECKS

Security would like to thank the Residents for their cooperation in continuing to lower the overall speed and reduce stop sign runs throughout the community. Security continues to remind visitors that the speed limit is 25 mph, which seems to be helping reduce speeding violations amongst guests. You may have noticed Security parked at Stop Signs throughout our community several times a day. We have seen a dramatic decrease in Stop Sign Violations and we are able to reduce Security's patrols for the time being. ### WILDLIFE PROBLEMS

ArrowCreek is one of many communities located in "Wilderness Urban Interface" area and, as such, residents may more frequently experience problems with animals, reptiles, and insects in or near their homes or property. Residents are responsible for any issue regarding wild animal/snakes etc., on their property. Security staff will assist by giving residents the correct phone number of the agency that may be able to assist them.



## TRASH CANS

We continue to see a high number of trash can violations. Waste Management picks up Mondays, and your trash cans need to be moved back inside by Monday Evening. Living in a mountainous community we have wildlife that will get into trash cans and strew them across the roads. So please help make our community beautiful and move your trash cans in. ### SCHOOL BUS STOPS

We have a new rule inside ArrowCreek that all Residents should be aware of. There is several Bus Stops along ArrowCreek Parkway and a few of them have a median. If you see the bus stopped with their "STOP SIGNS" out, even if there is a median, PLEASE stop regardless which way you are traveling. We have children crossing the road, sometimes in a hurry, and they may not look for vehicles.



We continue to ask all residents if you park at a bus stop to please stay back at least 30 feet from the intersection, and that all park on the same side of the street.

- 30 feet (about 2 car lengths) is so cars coming up to the intersection can see other cars, and not block incoming traffic.
- Same Side of the street is so you are not blocking traffic, and for emergency vehicles access.
- Arrowcreek & High Vista intersection: No Parking here. There is an area on High Vista & Rue St. Tropez that you are welcome to park at.

Security monitors all bus stops every morning and afternoon, and will remind parents to please follow the rules listed above. We would like to continue thanking everyone for following these simple steps to ensure the safety of all Residents and Your Children. DRAINAGE DITCH REPAIRS

We have had an extremely wet winter this year. An extraordinary number of snow and rain storms have hit ArrowCreek with a vengeance. As a result, there are several drainage ditches and other areas that breached and caused a significant amount of damage. We are currently having them repaired so there will be workers with heavy machinery alongside the roads. PLEASE be cautious and observant of your surroundings.

# DID YOU KNOW WE DO VACATION PATROLS?

Are you and your family about to head out for a long vacation? Let us put your mind at ease and ask to be added to our Vacation Watch Patrol. Security conducts 2 extra patrols per day to check on properties while residents are out of town.

- The First patrol is done early in the morning: between 5am to 7am.
- Then Swing (1-9pm) & Graveyard shift will check if needed, by resident call/concern.
- Security will check for any problems outside of residence that can be seen:
- Water Leaks
- Broken Windows
- > Open Doors
- > House Alarms
- > Cars parked in driveway, etc.

By providing us with contact info for your emergency contact/ house sitter, we can notify them ASAP if a problem arises. Residents can stop by the gatehouse and fill out a Vacation Request Form, or you can email the gatehouse requesting to be added to the list. Be sure to include:

- Address
- Dates you will be absent
- Best way to contact you, if possible
- Contact info for house sitter/ emergency contact

### INFORMATION & RESOURCE LIST FOR RESIDENTS

## YOUR QUICKPASS SYSTEM AND SECURITY:

Security would like to remind the Residents that are using their QuickPass account to continue to add permanent as well as temporary guests, and would ask the Residents that do not update their QuickPass account to please call Security so we can get your guests added before they arrive at the front gate.

Please keep in mind there is many calls coming into Security every day, (Residents calling in guests as well as all other Security issues), as well as many calls going out, (Security verifying guest access if they are not on the homeowners list). If you get a busy signal, please try again so we can assure your guest(s) can gain entry without incident.

Please note that if you leave a voicemail, there is no guarantee that it will be checked in time of your guest's arrival. There is many visitors and contractors entering ArrowCreek so having them on your list before they get here will cut the wait time at the gate tremendously. (We had over 1 Million vehicles pass through the front gate in 2016). When your guest(s) arrive if they are not on your list, Security must call to verify entry. This can cause a line to form and some guests must wait unnecessarily. If you have any questions about your account or how to add your guests, please call Leda at the front gate. If any resident is interested in getting a better working knowledge of QuickPass, feel free to contact Leda and schedule a time to go over the website.

### OTHER ITEMS TO KEEP IN MIND:

For the residents living behind the inside gates, when needing the gate held open for a party or event, there is a 2-business day notice required. Security will be willing to meet the request of parties of 5 vehicles or more only. Security will try to meet your request if an unexpected event occurs with less than 2 days' notice. Sometimes it will just not be possible.



- > Transponders are not intended/designed to be moved. If you do move a transponder from one vehicle to another, you need to let Security know so the QuickPass System can be updated. If a transponder has been moved and Security sees it is not on the vehicle we assigned it to, the transponder will be de-activated until you bring in the current vehicle's information. Also, if you move a transponder and it does not work, you need to purchase a new one.
- When you get a new vehicle, used vehicle, or just change your license plate, please contact Security with the updated vehicle information.
- > If you receive a vehicle transponder before your vehicle has been registered, please keep in mind that Security needs a copy of your registration within 30 days or the transponder will be deactivated. If you have a transponder that is not working contact Security.
- Please remember your dogs must be "walked on a leash" and you must clean up after your pets. Pet Mitt stations and trashcans have been placed around ArrowCreek Parkway. The park at Harbottle and the Resident Center needs special attention with cleaning up after your dogs. Complaints have started to be brought up about residents not picking up after their dogs.
- ➤ There is a lot of construction going on inside the ArrowCreek community. That means there is an increased number of large construction vehicles coming and going from the community. Please be patient with them on the roads and especially when these vehicles are entering at the gates. These construction workers are guests and they must follow the community rules and policies. Please report issues to Security.
- Motorcyclists, you can use the outside lane when entering ArrowCreek, but your motorcycle must have the Security issued sticker on it for identification purposes. Riding around the gate arm is not an acceptable way to enter. The stickers are free and be prepared to come to a complete stop before Security will raise the arm for entry.
