President's Message by Alan Liebman , Board President

The ACHOA Board approved a **2018 road reconstruction plan** and chose SNC as the low-bid vendor for this \$2.5 million project. This year we are replacing cracked roadbed on both East and West ArrowCreek Parkways as well as roadbed leading up to the gatehouse. This paving will slow all of us down some days during



May and June as we go in and out of the community. Please allow extra time on your excursions and cooperate with ArrowCreek Security and SNC traffic personnel to avoid harm to you and to them.

Many side streets are also going to be rebuilt or sealed following the recommendations of our paving consultant. Sealing treatments may close your street for a few hours. All such closures will be posted right at resident driveways. Emails will be sent so every affected resident is aware of the short travel interruption.

ArrowCreek HOA needs resident volunteers to join the Landscape Committee and continue plans to make the East ArrowCreek Parkway gateway corridor [from the gatehouse to the Residents Club] a showcase. The committee is also chartered to create a uniform plan for landscaping throughout ArrowCreek. If you have experience with landscape design or construction project management, or are an enthusiast of Northern Nevada horticulture, please contact community manager Jeanne Tarantino at ACService@AssociaSN.com and request a Landscape Committee member application form.

The Club at ArrowCreek [TCAC] announced in early April that its owner group, Friends of ArrowCreek, intends to sell the Club this Spring to Lucky Star LLC, a corporation entirely owned by three ArrowCreek resident families. This change suggests TCAC will have better financial backing going forward. Furthermore, the new owners are considering upgrades to the Club's facilities, possibly including a Clubhouse expansion, addition of swim and tennis facilities, and golf courses improvement. Your ACHOA Board is keeping abreast of these developments and will consider how actual TCAC changes should impact the plans of our Residents Club Improvement Task Force for ACHOA amenities expansion.

The facelift at your Residents Club should be almost completed as the swim and tennis season starts on Memorial Day weekend. New paint, flooring, furniture, seating, decorations and lighting are on order or being installed. This is a scheduled project paid for by your Reserve Fund monthly assessment.

Your ACHOA Board welcomes your ideas, constructive criticisms and volunteer participation in ArrowCreek governance. From the ArrowCreek Fuels and Fire Safety Committee

ATTENTION: ALL ARROWCREEK RESIDENTS

On Saturday morning, May 19, the County, in conjunction with ArrowCreek Fuels Reduction and Fire Safety Committee and ArrowCreek Security, will conduct a **Code Red Reverse 911 Test**. The phone calls will be received by residents by sections within ArrowCreek to enable Security staff to open all locked evacuation gates within each section.

Every residence with a "land line" installed telephone is automatically registered in the County's 911 database and will receive a Code Red Reverse 911 call. It will be clear in the message that this is only a TEST of the Code Red system, NOT an evacuation. To receive the Code Red Reverse 911 call, you must have registered your cell phone or unlisted land line number with the County. If you have moved and not re-registered your cell phone with your current address, you will NOT receive a call. To register, please go to www.ReadyWashoe.com.

Other Important News: Defensible Space inspections continue. Please consider changes in your landscape if your report indicated highly flammable trees or vegetation is too close to your house or your neighbor's house. Fuels reduction in all common areas continues to slow the potential progress of a wildfire in or around ArrowCreek. Some work is done by hand, some by a masticator, and some by spray. All work completed will help our firefighters if a wildfire occurs in our community.

<u>Coming Soon</u>: The Fuels Committee has finalized a revised <u>ArrowCreek HOA Evacuation Map</u> A copy of the map will be US mailed to all homeowners. Copies will also be available at the Residents' Club and the map will be posted on the <u>www.arrrowcreek-hoa.com</u> website.

Road Work

Greetings Homeowners!

As the saying goes there are two seasons in Northern Nevada. Winter and Road Construction. 2018 is a big year for ArrowCreek, with work taking place on the main thoroughfare ArrowCreek Parkway and many of the neighborhoods within the HOA. By the time you read this we should be well under way with the major road reconstruction of the ArrowCreek Parkway loop. We appreciate your patience and understanding during this necessary road work. Please allow a few more minutes to get to your destination as you may be required to take a detour or briefly stop due to lane closures. During the ArrowCreek Parkway loop road work there will be times when you must take the long way around to access the Entrance/Exit. Please be aware and courteous of traffic control workers. The HOA has emailed/mailed homeowners a detailed schedule of all the road work, and copies are also available at the Guard House Entrance and The Residences' Club. Should the schedule have significant changes, the HOA will make every effort to notify you of revised dates. We ask that all homeowners please take note if road work is scheduled in your neighborhood, and plan for the days you will be affected. Please



be aware if your neighborhood is scheduled to receive a fog seal or slurry seal you may not be able to drive on your street for that day from 7AM-6PM. Under normal conditions streets may be re-opened 4 to 6 hours after sealing is complete however it depends on the weather. Please plan accordingly. SNC the paving contractor will make every effort to open the roads as soon as possible. SNC will also place door hangers 24-48 hours in advance of the road work to alert residents of road closures in their neighborhood. Please turn off your sprinklers on the day work is scheduled on your street to avoid any runoff into the road. If you have concerns about the road work being done, please contact Brittney McVay at SNC at 775-355-0420. Thank you for your patience during this time and please use extra caution and take it slow in the cone zone.

VOLO VILLAGE - Communications Tool — Update

Volo Village is a new communication tool implemented by the ArrowCreek HOA (ACHOA) to send emergency information and quick announcements to keep ACHOA residents informed. At least two messages have been sent out so far. Below is some information that may help to clarify how Volo works and how you can update your account contact information:

- Every homeowner is already registered to receive Volo messages using the contact information you provided to the ACHOA.
- Your contact information in Volo is for ACHOA use only. The ACHOA completely controls all the communications sent.
- Each owner can update their contact information by logging into your Volo account at portal.volorecovery.com with your user name & password (previously sent). If you do not have a password, contact Associa Sierra North for assistance to set one up at ACservice@associasn.com or at 775-626-7333.
- ThunderCall Option. While in your Volo account you also have the option to sign up for weather alerts. These notifications come directly from the weather service, not the HOA.
- have modified how messages will be sent. This will North with any questions.

reduce the number of phone calls:

- Phone calls will only be made to the phone number provided in the *Home* field.
- Text messages will be sent to numbers in the Cell and Other fields. (Note, Other can be used if you want to add another cell phone number to receive messages).
- You have the option to enter your cell phone in both the Home and/or Cell field if you want a phone call and a text on your cell phone. Or, if you only want a phone call on your cell with no text, enter your cell in the *Home* field and nothing in the Cell
- The Work phone will not be used. If you want to receive calls on your work number, enter your work number in the *Home* field.
- Emails will generally be sent via a separate email blast and not typically through Volo.

SAFETY ALERT ABOUT KIDS, GOLF CARTS AND USE OF GOLF CART AND WALKING PATHS

In the past there have been incidents with under-aged kids driving golf carts in un-approved areas with multiple passengers, over the limit of the cart. This activity is very dangerous! If you have kids and golf carts, please be aware to share the rules with your kids to keep your kids and the residents of ArrowCreek safe. Below are the rules on golf carts and the use of Golf Cart and Walking Paths in the community. Thank you!

ACHOA RULES:

Article IV, Section 4.41 – Operating of Motor Vehicles (see Traffic Enforcement Policy):

Motorized vehicles except authorized maintenance vehicles or emergency vehicles may be prohibited on all open spaces, paths, trails, walkways or common areas (except street or parking areas) See the below 'Combination Golf Cart and Walking Paths Use Restrictions'.

Motorized Scooters (replaced the policy of 4/9/02): Motorized Scooters (Replaces the Policy dated 4/9/02): With the exception of golf carts and children's battery operated moving toys, no motorized scooters may operate on the pedestrian / bicycle pathways, nor are they permitted on Arrowcreek roads unless they are properly registered and licensed.

Bicycles: All bicycles must comply with all motor vehicle codes and regulations and must operate according to safe rules of the road.

Combination Golf Cart and Walking Paths Use Restrictions' (Approved 12/6/16):

- 1. Combination Paths are defined as
 - a. The paved pathways on both sides of East and West ArrowCreek Parkways
 - b. The sections of the walking paved pathways at the following locations may be used by golf carts:
 - i. Winding Ridge: from Cocopah Court along Winding Ridge to the Tee Box at Hole 16
 - ii. Masters Drive: from High Vista at Master's Drive to the 2nd Green
 - iii. High Vista: Through Harbottle Park
- 2. All other areas of paved pathways along community roadways are designated as Walking Paths and golf carts are prohibited.
- 3. Golf Carts are required to operate on ArrowCreek Parkway Combination Paths and not drive on ArrowCreek Parkway itself. This rule includes all golf carts as well as ArrowCreek HOA and The Club at ArrowCreek utility carts (except as required to complete maintenance projects).
- 4. On all other streets, golf carts must operate on the roadway and not on the walking paths. Every person operating a golf cart upon a roadway shall, except:
 - a. When preparing to turn left; or
 - b. When doing so would not be safe,
 - > drive as near to the right side of the roadway as practicable, exercising due care when passing a standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction.
- 5. When encountering a pedestrian on designated combination paths, golf cart drivers must stop and allow the pedestrian(s) to pass safely.
- 6. Golf cart paths on The Club at ArrowCreek golf course are private property not belonging to the ArrowCreek HOA and are restricted for the use of golfers and/or those authorized by The Club only.

Golf Cart and Golf Cart Operator Requirements for Use in ArrowCreek (Approved 12-6-16):

- 1. Inspection of personal golf carts by ACHOA Security is not required.
- 2. Drivers of golf carts on ArrowCreek roadways or combination cart paths must be 14 years of age or older.
- 3. Drivers 14 to 16 years of age may not carry passengers apart from family members.
- 4. The number of occupants is not to exceed the designed seating capacity of the cart.
- 5. Golf carts which are driven after dark must have appropriate safety equipment including head lamps, tail lamps, stop lamps, and rearview mirror(s).
